## USER MANUAL

Thank you so much for choosing Uschi's! In the following we would like to provide you with some info on the easy and straightforward assembly process. Actually it's so easy and self explaining that we'd rather like to give you some basic tipps in regards to assembly. Is that ok? Rodger that! Let's do this!



- 1.) White glue a.k.a. carpenter glue or PVA glue
- 2.) A suitable brush. Rather slim for framework and alike, or broad as a chisel for larger surfaces
- 3.) A Black marker
- 4.) A fresh hot blade
- 5.) A ruler (preferably metal)
- 6. A lil bit of water for diluting the glue or cleaning the brush. Pls consider light moisturing of MDF prior to glue application.

TIPP: Apply flat Clear varnish on glossy spots and surfaces

Separate framework from panels. Apply the isolated framework onto the MDF frame using PVA glue. The level of depth can be adjusted by whether or not a dministering some s ort of pads beneath of the print. You know what I mean? Like if you want panels or the window's glass sitting a bit higher, just feed some cardboard beneath of the print. It's your kingdom! You decide! Also consider to construct sub-assemblies being stabilized with a paper backdrop. That would allow you being more flexible while mounting said sub-assembly onto the MDF backdrop. Consider using plastic or actual glass for the windows. Use pigments and powders.



The assembly of the crane does not require a detailed step by step. Would you agree? B.t.w. ,the cable is not included in the kit. I'm sorry. But you know...... I mean......that's a thing you as an able m odeler can deal with, aye? I wonder if we should try some chain....



On this early prototype we did not glue the printed framework ontop of the actual frames. You should do that though, as being visible on the picture on top. That's the thing about this product actually. Well, now you made it this far... you can actually put in the model for an arrangement test and decide on what else to add. We already have included a clock and some barrels. Consider power cables and maybe an air duct. How about some lamps? A ladder? It's your kingdom! Again thank you very much and as always...... enjoy
